METHODOLOGY

Simulation of scenarios of aquatic events:

1. SCENARIO A (WATER):
 - a. Aquatic event and rescue
 - b. Transfer water team / ground team
2. SCENARIO B (GROUND):
 - a. Ground BLS
 - b. Transfer from ground team to EMS-transport team



Each simulation includes:

1. Scenario presentation: The instructor introduces the case of a drowning victim, indicating the symptoms and signs
2. Development and intervention: The instructor and participants treat the patient with the needed specific skills
3. Debriefing: The group reviews the scenario to obtain feedback from the intervention

During aquatic rescue, participants will be able to train the next skills:

- In-water breathing
- Rescue from boat
- CPR in rescue boat during transport

Number of participants: limited to 12 per session.

Participants in the aquatic part will need a wetsuit. The organization will provide wetsuits, adequate spaces for dressing-undressing and hot shower besides the rescue area. There is the option to observe the scenario from the ground and participate in the debriefing session.

The activity and participants will be covered by the global Congress insurance.
