The Role of Health Emergency Technician

The law called "Real Decreto 836/2012" makes a very clear line in what was done before and what should be done in the future in the world of the hospital emergencies.

Twenty years ago, the patients transport was in Spain very poor, not only in the kind of vehicles used at the time, but also in the given material they carried and in the training of the staff.

To accomply with the new law every Technician in Sanitary Emergencies must have done a course of 2000 hours and must be qualified to use an automatic defribillator.

In Spain we have more than 2200 Emergencies Vehicles where more than 18000 Technicians in Sanitary Emergencies work, and there is also a number of 18000 Technicians in Sanitary Emergencies who work in the non-emergencies transport.

To try that the first answer to a PCR is always a SVA unit can be considered as an inefficient and poor answer in the sanitary management.

By experience we know that whoever first arrives to the place should have a DESA with them: Police officers, Firemen, Ambulances, SVB, SVA,

In order to arrive to the 100% of thte population in a faster way an specific course should be created in schools where first aid should be taught
